WARM UP

ASK THIS:

Does anyone have a special meaning or story related to their first or middle name? What is it?

THE TEXT: WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR ME?

Ask someone to read Genesis 17:4-6

READ THIS:

Abraham was the first of 5 people in the bible to be given a new name by God: Abram to Abraham, Sarai to Sarah (Genesis 17:15-16), Jacob to Israel (Genesis 32:24-28), Simon to Peter (1 John 1:40-42) and Saul to Paul (Acts 13).

ASK THIS:

What do you think God's overall purpose was in changing their names?

Ask someone to read Ephesians 3:14-21

ASK THIS

According to Ephesians 3:14-15;

- What is our identity as Christians?
- How does understanding our relationship to God as Father help us to approach Him in prayer?

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- In what ways can our biological father affect our relationship with our heavenly Father?

Leader Tip: *In the exercise below you may choose to allow each person to create their own list on a sheet of paper and then share their findings or you may want to do this as a group by having just one person write down the list of Paul's petitions.*

SAY THIS:

In many of Paul's writings he is so impassioned about his message that his words flow seamlessly into each other. It is important for us to slow down and break the passage into bite size chunks, allowing the truth to be revealed more clearly. In Ephesians 3:16-19, Paul is praying for believers (us); let's take a few minutes and list his specific petitions.

ASK THIS:

- How does Paul's prayer differ from your prayers?
- In what ways does Paul's prayer motivate you to pray differently?

SAY THIS:

In Ephesians 3:18 Paul is praying that we would be able to "comprehend the length and width, height and depth of God's love".

ASK THIS:

- How does comprehending God's love help us deal with our personal sin?
- If you were able to comprehend God's love, how would it change the way you view the world? Your neighbors?

SAY THIS:

Paul also prays that we would be "filled with all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19)

ASK THIS:

- How would you describe being filled with the fullness of God?
- For what purpose are we filled with God's fullness?

DO THIS:

Have the whole group read Ephesians 3:20 together aloud 3x.

Leader Tip: *Since the group members may have various bible translations you may want to provide a member copy of this curriculum, present it on a TV screen or simply turn this page around so all can read from it.*

Now to Him who is able to do above and beyond all that what we ask or think according to the power that works in us-

DO THIS:

Have someone read Ephesians 1:18-23

Leader Tip: *In this section the questions will be directed at challenging your members to evaluate their effectiveness as a group in the context of being filled with the fullness of God and plugged into His power. It may be helpful to write down the group's answers to the following questions for the purpose of reviewing and exercising the group's ideas in the future.*

SAY THIS:

As our group members personally grow in the fullness of God and plug into His power, our group should also naturally reflect a growth in unity, spiritual development and effectiveness. Let's tackle these next set of questions with Ephesians 1:18-23 & 3:20 in mind. **Dream Big!** Through Christ and the power of His resurrection we have no limitations!

ASK THIS:

- In what ways do we utilize the talents of each our members to strengthen the whole group?
- How could we leverage the talents within our group to provide better organization and efficiency?
- What are some indicators that reveal we have grown together spiritually as a group?
- What are some practices we can implement in our meetings that encourage spiritual accountability?
- What actions do we regularly exercise as a group that clearly exhibits the power of God working through us?
- What direction do you feel God moving our group to make an impact in our community?
